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Insertional Achilles tendinopathy can also occur in association with inflammatory arthropathies, corticosteroid use, diabetes, hypertension, obesity, gout, and fluoroquinolone antibiotics28. Patients typically present with stiffness and a palpable, irritated, painful bump at the Achilles tendon insertion34.

However, chronic Achilles tendinosis is a complex pathology involving microscopic degenerative injury to the tendon with local disruption of the collagen matrix and microscopic degenerative injury. With chronic Achilles tendinosis, there is also evidence of erratic blood flow with zones of hypovascularization and hypervascularization.

Achilles tendon pain: Causes, when to see a doctor, and ...

You may need to avoid exercise for several days or switch to an activity that doesn't strain the Achilles tendon, such as swimming. In severe cases, you may need to wear a walking boot and use crutches. Ice. To decrease pain or swelling, apply an ice pack to the tendon for about 15 minutes after exercising or when you experience pain. Compression. Wraps or compressive elastic bandages can help reduce swelling and reduce movement of the tendon.

Overview Achilles tendinitis is an overuse injury of the Achilles (uh-KILL-eez) tendon, the band of tissue that connects calf muscles at the back of the lower leg to your heel bone. Achilles tendinitis most commonly occurs in runners who have suddenly increased the intensity or duration of their runs.

Paratenonitis is an acute Achilles injury caused by overuse. It involves inflammation of the covering of the Achilles tendon. "In really acute cases, the tendon can appear sausage-like, because it is so severely swollen," says Russell Warren, MD, a sports medicine orthopedic surgeon at Hospital for Special Surgery in New York.

Chronic Achilles Tendon Problems: An Overview

Achilles tendonitis is an inflammation of the Achilles tendon. This inflammation is typically short-lived. Over time, if not resolved, the condition may progress to a degeneration of the tendon (Achilles tendonosis), in which the tendon loses its organized structure and is likely to develop microscopic tears.

Pain in the Achilles tendon is seen commonly in middle-aged athletes (30-50 years of age) who are involved in a variety of sports (3-8); running is the sport most commonly reported (prevalence≈9%). (3, 4, 8-11) Pain is experienced either in the mid-portion of the tendon or at the tendon's bony insertion and is a common cause of disability.
