Claudius became emperor shortly after his nephew was assassinated by his bodyguard, on January 24, A.D. 41. The tradition is that the Praetorian Guard, located the aging scholar hiding behind a curtain, dragged him forth and made him emperor, although James Romm, in his 2014 exploration of the real Seneca, *Dying Every Day: Seneca at the Court of Nero*, says that it is likely that Claudius knew the plans in advance.

Claudius and Aelia Paetina were married in 28 AD, and their only child – Claudia Antonia – was born in 30 AD. (Claudia Antonia was executed in 65 or 66, during the reign of Emperor Nero.) The year after the birth of their daughter, Claudius divorced his second wife after her adoptive brother Sejanus had lost power and been murdered.
