Respite centers provide meals, basic first aid or medical care, fresh clothing, showers, temporary shelter and general guidance.

As of June, the NGOs' combined efforts reached 47,161 people in these migrant communities, in which almost 30 per cent are children. The most impacted however are migrant children who attend migrant learning centres (MLCs), as they are still learning from home in their communities until the migrant education coordination centre (MECC) and coordinators of MLCs mutually agree on reopening, which is expected to be in October.

Children and teachers in migrant learning centres face ...

Many immigrant children are in migrant families that move across the country seeking seasonal or temporary employment in a variety of industries. “Migrant children” may work in the industries in which their family members are employed and move frequently because of changes in their parents’ employment.

Providing Care for Immigrant, Migrant, and Border Children ...

The tutors come from a migrant family background and are full-time college students who are pursuing teaching credentials. Mini-Corps tutors work with migratory students during the school year and summer school as role models to strengthen their relationships among students, teachers, family members, and members of the community.

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
